



Kāhui Ako Principals

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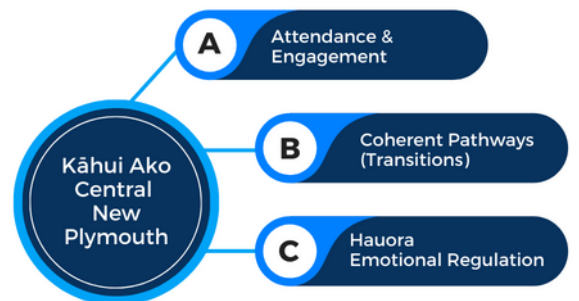

ACROSS SCHOOL LEADERS

In Term 1, our primary focus was on fostering whakawhānaungatanga and building connections. However, in Term 2, we have now shifted our attention to examining the Achievement Challenges and their implementation in each school. During our visits to our Kāhui Ako schools, the Across School Leaders have identified some shared practices related to Attendance & Engagement, Transitions, and Hauora, as well as some notable differences.

We are currently exploring the following questions:

- What are the trends across schools with respect to the Achievement Challenges?
- What does the latest research on best practices suggest for each of the Achievement Challenges?
- What steps can we take to enhance our systems and processes for addressing the Achievement Challenges?

Our final school visit will take place in Week 3 at Welbourn School, and we are excited to learn more about their kura.
